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A MESSAGE FROM CHIEF OF POLICE ROY RICE



GREETINGS! With bringing Deputy Chief Trevor Thron into the Administrative Circle last year, the department has developed a strong Administrative Team with a vision to improve operations and community service. The department has much needed new body worn cameras that are more dependable and reliable than the previous body worn cameras used by the officers. The NM Municipal League made this possible by reimbursing the city for the purchases of the cameras. The city also purchased new in-car video systems and radar trailers to assist with traffic enforcement.



The Public Safety Aide program is developing and becoming more advantageous to the citizens and the department, and the Communications Office was upgraded with equipment.

The year 2024 started off with violence and we experienced a rough year with a total of five homicides. There were nine homicides reported in 2023. The tragic loss of life involving juveniles and young adults were the main cause of the homicides.

There was an increase in the index crimes for the year. Sex Crimes were up five reports over 2023 with fifty-four cases reported to the CPD. There were three more robberies reported over last year and nine Aggravated Assaults more than the previous year.

There were three more burglaries reported in 2024 than there were in 2023. Larceny and Thefts came in with one hundred fifty-five more reports than last year. There were twenty-one more motor vehicles stolen this year compared to last year.

But even with the violence and increase in property crimes, there were a lot of positive things put in place that will prepare the department for the future and benefit the citizens.

The Public Safety Aide program is proving to be beneficial to the department and the citizens by providing quicker response and allowing the officers to tend to enforcement duties and investigations. Another benefit to the PSA is the training and experience they gather while working has prepared several of their members to move into the Police Uniform and become a quicker asset to the department.

We have expanded the PSA responsibilities in assisting Code Enforcement and later in the year we added a specialized PSA Member to the Special Operations Unit to assist with Crime Scene investigations.

We closed the year with a successful Cops and Kids Christmas Shopping event that surpassed all of the other years. We were able to allow more kids to go shopping and gave them more to spend thanks to the generosity of the local businesses and citizens.

And even though I will not be here to witness it, the Clovis Police Department is looking forward to the year 2025 with several new projects/programs planned to increase service to the community. I would like to thank the City Manager, City Staff and the individual Departments of the City for their support and cooperation throughout the year because we could not have done our job as easily without you. We thank the Mayor and the Commission for their support and allowing us to do our jobs. We thank the citizens of Clovis for their support throughout the year.

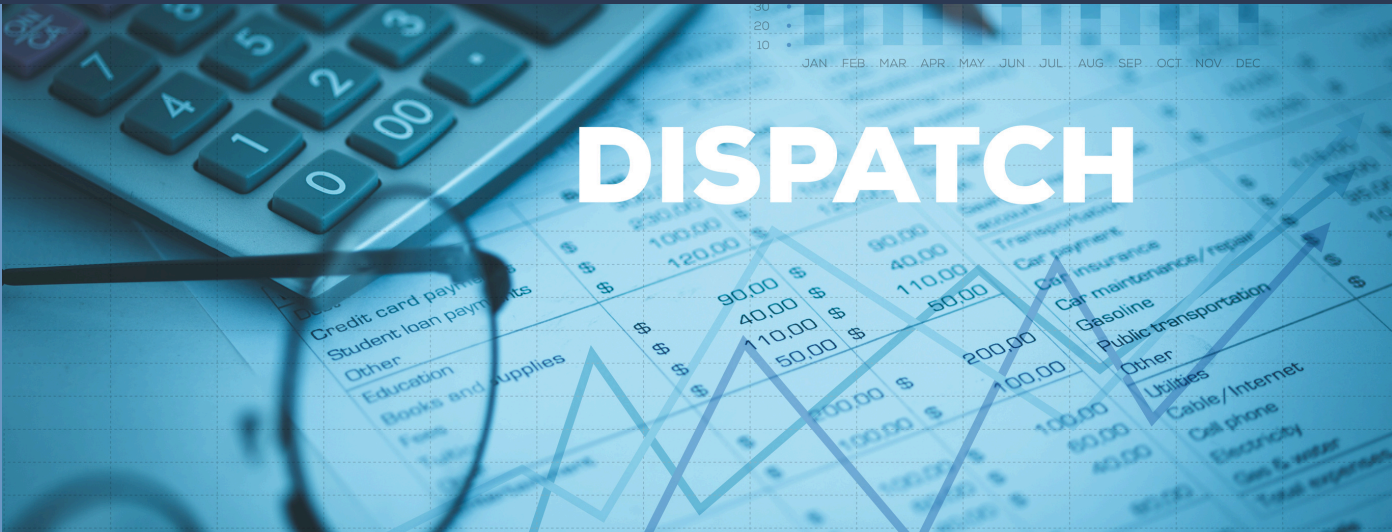

COMMUNICATIONS CENTER



The Communications Center is the primary point for all 9-1-1 calls for the City of Clovis and dispatches for the Clovis Police Department, the Clovis Fire Department and 9 other entities. The center is staffed 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.

The Communications Center answers both emergency and non-emergency calls and act as a liaison between the members of the community, other agencies, department personnel and field units in support of organizational goals and objectives. This team supports multiple departments and communities.

CRASH, D.W.I & PATROL STATISTICS



The traffic unit's primary role for the agency is traffic enforcement. Whether it is on a marked police motorcycle or sedan or SUV, they work in the traffic problem areas, traffic accidents, DUI's and back up and assist on calls as needed.

CRASH TEAM

The Clovis Police Department Crash Team is made up of officers from the Traffic Unit, Detectives and Patrol Officers who have chosen to be called out to investigate vehicle crashes that are fatal or could result in a fatality. These officers are on call 24/7/365 and have demonstrated their ability to investigate, photograph, measure and document a crash scene. They have members trained in reconstruction of a crash and determine the cause of the crash and testify in court when needed.
